Professor Lynn Ang is Professor of Early Childhood at the Department of Learning and Leadership, UCL Institute of Education in the UK. Lynn's expertise is early learning, early childhood education and international evidence-based research particularly in developing country contexts. She has led and co-led many major research grants including the first systematic review of early childhood development and peacebuilding policies across 14 conflict-affected countries (2015-2016) funded by the UN and UNICEF. Lynn is Co-Principal Investigator of a 5-year study to assess the impact of The World Bank US\$23 million Early Learning Partnership (ELP) programme (2018–22) and Principal Investigator of the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) funded project 'Manor Park Talks' (2018–20), an evidence-based intervention programme of professional development to improve the outcomes for disadvantaged two-year-olds in Manor Park, Newham, UK. Lynn's most recent project includes Co-Investigator of the UK-funded multi-disciplinary research hub 'Action Against Stunting' (2019-2025; £19.76 million) which aims to tackle the complex global challenge of child stunting in India, Indonesia and Senegal in the interdisciplinary field of epigenetics, health, nutrition, agriculture, biological science and education. Lynn is Senior Fellow of the Higher Education Academy in England and supervisor of Doctorate students.
